## Methodology

This tracking poll was designed and directed by SocialSphere, Inc. and conducted by landline and cell phone between July 7 and July 8 and July 13 and July 15, 2014 among a random sample of $\mathrm{N}=605$ likely, registered voters in Massachusetts (including $n=362$ with likely voters in the Democratic primary). The margin of error for the total sample is $\pm 4.0$ points at the $95 \%$ confidence interval and $\pm 5.1$ points for the Democratic primary match-up. Sampling and data collection (live interviewing) was performed by American Directions Group.
